To illustrate, and in a bit of a twist from the usual, *My Library Story* features this month's grand reopening celebration at West Covina Library. Read on, and consider heading to Paramount Library for its reopening festivities.

As you know well, books can take you to all kinds of places, times, and people. So, if you haven't already signed up, race to get going with Summer Discovery Program!!

It's not just for kids. It's for people of ALL ages and it's a mix of reading and completing Library activities. My Library Story: Community Matters

<u>West Covina Library</u> reopened earlier this month after more than three years. The celebration was standing-room only, and overflowing with delight. The redesigned and bright space features a reconfigured children's section, a teen space, and new seating, laptops to check out, banks for computers, and shelves chock full of great books.

Walking into the library's grand opening celebration, a woman exclaimed, "I am SO happy to have my library back, I've missed you!"

That was the theme for the day, which featured a welcome back from Supervisor Hilda Solis, Library totes to color, a 3D photo booth, a bubble-making extravaganza, and plenty of time to take in the newly renovated space.



Typical of the love people have for their library, the celebration drew former and current residents, as well as Library staff who had previously worked at West Covina Library and wanted to see how this cherished space had been transformed.

Nancy K and her husband John had traveled across town for the opening. This was Nancy's library growing up, filled with memories of wandering through the stacks in elementary school, and in high school using it as an after-school spot to study and meet up with friends.

She commented on the radiant light filled space - laughing, she said, "it used to be so dark in here I couldn't always read the titles on the spines of books." Several people nodded in agreement.

When the formal program ended, parents, grandparents, and youngsters headed to the second floor, eager to see the reconfigured children's area. Library users of all ages flocked to cozy chairs, a bank of new computers, and stacks filled with enticing reads.

Library staff and community members mingled, sharing stories and enjoying the new space and furniture. The smiles, joyful conversations, and stream of Library Champions checking out materials spoke eloquently to the power of libraries to connect, meeting individual and community needs.

Virtual Field Trip: West Hollywood Library, Pride all year-long

<u>West Hollywood Library</u> consistently appears in lists of not-to-be-missed libraries. Little wonder considering this LEED Gold certified library – situated in a city park – is architecturally spectacular and includes a Shepard Fairey mural (*Peace, Freedom, and Creativity*), and a small scale version of Michelangelo's Laurentian Library that serves as the Children's Theater.

That's not to mention changing art exhibits from West Hollywood Arts Council, special collections that include the LGBT Collection and Ron Shipton HIV Information Center, three book clubs, in-person and online events, and a vibrant Friends of the Library group that runs what is arguably "one of the most interesting used bookstores you will ever visit."

West Hollywood Library welcomes you to explore their collection and library and to learn about and <u>celebrate the LGBTQ+ community</u>. The library also hosts a long-running drag storytime, having been one of the first libraries in the country to do so.

Pride doesn't get tucked into one month with your Library. And it doesn't exist solely at West Hollywood Library. LGBTQ+ Pride continues year-round – with activities, book lists, and suggestions for a DIY virtual film fest.

And remember, you don't have to travel to West Hollywood Library to get the title you want – though a trip to the library is definitely worth it! Simply find the material that interests you in the Library catalog, place a hold, and have it delivered to your library of choice.



Unbanning Books. West Hollywood Poet Laureate Jen Cheng invited your Library Foundation to showcase <u>Books Unbanned</u> at a Grand Performances event titled Poetics of Pride + Legacy.

Dancers and poets moved throughout the delighted audience, "unbanning" into their hands dozens of books that had been challenged because of their LGBTQ+ content and/or authors.

Your Library's Books Unbanned program, with Foundation support, gives any teen anywhere in California access to any ebook or audiobook in the

Library's entire digital collection.

Our goal is to support the freedom to read, explore, and learn from a range of titles and develop informed opinions.

To date, more than 1,000 13-18 year olds from 253 cities in California have applied for a Books Unbanned card and checked out 5,054 items.



Rainbow Parenting and Family Programs launched this month at five libraries: West Hollywood Library, East Los Angeles Library, Culver City Julian Dixon Library, Angelo M. Iacoboni Library (Lakewood), and Lancaster Library.

These programs – specially designed for families of younger kids, ages birth through 5 years – provide a safe space for LGBTQ+ families in the library. They also create opportunities to build community through meeting other local families, sharing experiences, and inspiring and encouraging one another.
