LA County Library Foundation looks back to 2022 with gratitude for you, Library Champion. With your Library Foundation, you helped fuel Library programs and services for children, teens, and adults across our vast county – with 85

unique and welcoming community libraries, a mobile fleet, and a 24/7 digital library.

From reading and lifelong learning programs, to support for your Library staff, to inspiring students to explore, you made a meaningful difference. In a time of challenge and demand, you helped build connection, creativity, and engagement.

Thank you for stepping up, for helping meet that need with your gifts to LA County Library Foundation and your commitment to your Library.



I hope you'll enjoy this review of what you, with your LA County Library Foundation, helped make possible in 2022, and that you'll savor what lies ahead and the opportunity to help do even more.

Last year, against a national backdrop of plummeting student scores for reading and math, and a growing demand for connection at all ages, Library Champions stepped up. You supported a range of Library programs that inspired learning, engagement, and creative thinking.

Your generous gifts helped fuel participation in **Summer Discovery Program** – a celebration of reading for ALL ages, from babies and toddlers to older adults. 12,683 readers logged 41,188 books! That's not to mention the nearly 11,000 people who worked on Library activity challenges. Those numbers translate into



making lives better - creating connections, encouraging exploration, and helping students continue learning over the summer.

With you, and generous support from Via Care Community Health Center, the Foundation supported **Teen Read Month.** Teens celebrated all things related to teens and reading, with a special BINGO game, curated booklists, and with DIY and in-library activities.

Tweens and teens explored potential careers and issues of sustainability in five fields – entomology, space exploration, waste management, public works, and marine ecology – thanks to **Careers in STEAM** funded by Edison International.

Ten libraries provided 1,250 program-related activity kits, and approximately 900 viewers attended three virtual programs (Ballona Creek Trash Interceptor Pilot Project, NASA's Journey to Mars, and Pride and Prejudice and Scorpions).



Staff at Claremont Helen Renwick Library reported that, thanks to a grant from the Mellon Foundation, teens are finding its **graphic novel section** "...brand new and bursting at the seams! Our teens, who are so engaged with digital media, really appreciate the mix of art and storytelling."

The Mellon Foundation also funded a series of Theatre of Hearts **arts** workshops for children and teens, and LA Opera's *Sing Out Loud* for children and

families at the library.

Student creativity was on display with the Library's **43nd Annual Bookmark Contest**. The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors selected 20 kindergarten through high school winners, from nearly 10,000 entries.

A disproportionate number of older adults, and people with diabetes, have low vision, and a gift from the First Presbyterian Church of Santa Monica seeded a Foundation initiative to meet that need with **ebooks and audiobooks**, an effort that continues.

Titles purchased to date range from healthy cooking to building relationships, to medical references to career exploration, to wellness and sports, to cultural



awareness and inclusion to healthy cooking, and include non-fiction, novels, memoirs, and mysteries.

The Carson Library and community continue to benefit from generous support from the Watson Land Company for education materials and programs.


Your Library is a cornerstone of the community, a place that welcomes all, and that provides opportunities for socioeconomic success.
