**Virtual Field Trip: Exploring and  
Celebrating Black & African American  
History at the Black Resource Center and  
beyond**

[The Black Resource Center \(BRC\)](#) founded in 1978, is located at A C Bilbrew Library (in an unincorporated area west of the city of Compton). It's filled with stories, information, and art. Learn about remarkable people and events who've shaped our community - like Madame A C Bilbrew.

*She was the first Black person to have a radio show. Madame Bilbrew was also an internationally recognized musician, poet, and choral director, as well as a community leader and a deputy to former Los Angeles County Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.*

The Library's Black Resource Center (BRC) is a marvelous resource for answering the theme of this year's Black History Month - Black Resistance - a call for everyone to explore the history of Black Americans.

The BRC collects specialized materials by and about African Americans and Blacks, the African American and Black experience, and the African Diaspora.

You'll find treasures of all sorts - physical and digital information, photographs, and throughout the BRC and library, paintings, prints, fabric works, and sculptures from the acclaimed Golden State Mutual Art Collection.

You'll discover new information about well-known figures, and find out about vital people, places, and events that weren't in the spotlight.

You can sift through old and current newspapers and dig through documents and papers on microform, including Slave Narratives and Papers of the NAACP. The BRC is a scholar's and any learner's haven.

Can't make it to A C Bilbrew Library and the BRC? Not a problem. Many of the materials will travel to you - find them in the Library's catalog, place a hold, and pick them up at your library of choice.

Get started with some of these goodies your Librarians have put together for you:

- A [curated booklist](#) for African American and Black History Month, with titles for all ages
- [A playlist of music](#) by Black jazz musicians
- A [video introduction](#) of African American physician and medical researcher Charles Drew. Dr. Drew is credited with saving many lives in WWII and beyond, thanks to his research in blood banks
- [African American cinema and documentaries](#) on Kanopy
