Virtual Field Trip: Carson Library

Library Champion and Seattle Seahawks linebacker Uchenna Nwosu was thrilled to help celebrate the reopening of Carson Library in December 2023.

Carson Library and the community mean a lot to Uchenna. He said that as children, he and his two sisters spent many afternoons after school and on the weekends at the Library. Education is key he told the audience, including for athletes. Giving back to his hometown, Uchenna is funding a My Brother's Keeper Peer Advocate based at Carson Library.

You won't be surprised to know that, like your community library, [Carson Library](#) is well loved. So when it reopened last December - after being closed for renovation for four years - people were ecstatic. The wait was worth it.

Library staff, Friends of the Carson Library, Library Commissioners, and Foundation staff joined a full house of Library Champions, including Supervisor Holly Mitchell, officials from the City of Carson, the Carson senior cheer squad, Watson Land Company representatives, and Carson native and Seattle Seahawks player Uchenna Nwosu, to celebrate.

Carson Library is special to Trini Jimenez, Watson Land Company's Vice President of Public Affairs (pictured at the library's December reopening with Library Director Skye Patrick). His wife grew up with Carson Library and credits long afternoons at the library with her continuing love of learning. Watson Land Company is also a longtime supporter - their generosity funded the elegant and efficient new Customer Service desk.

Carson Library is one of the largest of LA County Library's 86 locations, occupying more than 33,000 square feet and annually serving 71,000 library users across more than 19 square miles.

The \$2.3 million renovation added furniture and a new customer service desk, as well as two study rooms, a space for teens and one for children, a meeting room that seats 125, and a workforce center. Add to that new computers for children, adults, and early learners. Plus EV charging stations you can use while you enjoy the library.

My Library Story: Gary M.



literacy and educational goals, and help their mental health and emotional wellness.
