West Hollywood Library welcomes you to explore their collection and Library and to learn about and celebrate the LGBTQ+ community.

"We're proud to celebrate every color of the pride flag and we've got a book for every member of the alphabet community!"

Find books for all ages on multiple displays around the library, as well as the Ron Shipton HIV Information Center and the LGBT Collection on the 2nd floor. Happy Pride Month!"

Library Manager Matt Gill is proud the library was one of the first libraries in the country to host a Drag Story Hour, in 2017, with the support of the City of West Hollywood.



In addition to special collections, three book clubs, and in-person and online events, the LEED Gold certified library is architecturally vibrant and has changing art exhibits from the city's Arts Council.

Plus, you don't want to miss the Shepard Fairey mural (*Peace, Freedom, and Creativity*), or the marvelous Children's Theater - a small scale version of Michelangelo's Laurentian Library.

So, go if you get a chance. And if it's not in the cards, remember you've got access to that treasure trove of books and other materials at West Hollywood Library...just find what you want in the card catalog, place a hold, and pick it up at your library of choice.

Author David Ambroz (*A Place Called Home - A Memoir*) joined Library Champions at East Los Angeles Library last week in a Heart & Hand Book Talk Series conversation with Library Director Skye Patrick.

David talked about growing up homeless, navigating the foster care system, how he got to where he is today - a poverty and child welfare advocate - and how you can move from empathy to taking action for positive change.

He views the Library as a powerful force for the communities from which he began and is working to help - people in poverty, foster youth, individuals struggling with mental illness, and the LGBTQ+ community.
