Book: *Becoming Mary Sully: Toward an American Indian Abstract* by Philip J. Deloria (2019)

Yankton Dakota artist Mary Sully (1896-1963) is known for her abstract style using symmetrical geometric shapes. She often created works that represented famous people of her time, including Babe Ruth and Gertrude Stein.





The AIRC is the largest public library collection of its kind in the U.S. Fitting for a county that is home to more people of Native heritage than any other county in the U.S.

Like all LA County Library locations, you're welcomed – and encouraged – to stop by, whether you're doing academic research, seeking resources or referrals to services, or looking for a great read.





